Our Vision


To create communities within a landscape that are resistant to the devastating impacts of wildland fires.

WHERE WE WORK

The Butte County Fire Safe Council implements projects and provides wildfire safety services to residents county-wide through grants and community donations.

What is the WUI?

The Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) is an area with high wildfire risk, where housing and development meet or intermingle with undeveloped wildland areas. There are over 450,000 acres of WUI in Butte County, shown below in yellow.

PROGRAMS

Resident Assistance Program

Our no-cost Resident Assistance Program aids landowners in maintaining 100 feet of defensible space around their home, with an emphasis on supporting those in the WUI who qualify as elderly, disabled, or low income.

Chipper Program

The Chipper Program assists landowners county-wide in reducing their wildfire risk by chipping hazardous fuels. Residents can sign up year-round for our no-cost service that broadcasts or piles chips, providing an alternative to burning or hauling brush.
